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Prospective objects

Exhibition with Lucie Lanzini & Margré Steensma
from September 6 to October 13, 2018 at *Plagiarama*

Lucie Lanzini creates sculptures made of molded parts of glass and resin. She molds fragments of architectural and decorative elements. According to an inversion principle, the new created object is a print of the missing original.

Margré Steensma works from everyday objects. She changes their material, diverting them from their original function. She uses these autonomous shapes to create new abstract spaces, that everybody is invited to invest.

Lucie Lanzini and Margré Steensma are both working on the object from its material, transforming the linked semantic corpus, allowing distance. Those artists, while reshaping the objects and their meaning, participate to a reappropriation of the reality.

Lucie Lanzini crée des sculptures composées d'éléments moulés, de verre et de résine. Elle moule des fragments d'éléments architecturaux et décoratifs. Selon un principe d'inversion, le nouvel objet créé est donc une empreinte de l'original absent.

Margré Steensma travaille à partir d'objets issus du quotidien. Elle en change les matériaux et les détourne de leur fonction originale. Elle utilise ces formes autonomes pour créer de nouveaux espaces abstraits, que chacun est invité à investir.

Lucie Lanzini et Margré Steensma sont des artistes qui travaillent toutes deux l'objet à partir de la matière, transformant le corpus sémantique qui lui est lié, permettant une mise à distance. Ces deux artistes, en remodelant les objets et leur sens, participent à une réappropriation de la réalité.



Lucie Lanzini cultive une sensibilité particulière aux souvenirs et à la mémoire. Son travail s'appuie sur un répertoire de signes, d'objets "référents", en constante re-création. Son processus de création s'exprime autour de notions oscillant entre morcèlement et lien, présence et absence, vide et plein. Reprenant des formes issues du réel, les œuvres de l'artiste révèlent une réalité cachée derrière l'apparence des choses. Elle part d'éléments: objets, animaux, mobilier, ornementation, détails d'architecture, pour les traiter de façon minimale tout en conservant des fragments rappelant la source d'origine. Le signifiant habituel s'en trouve contourné, l'artiste crée un décalage d'où surgit une étrangeté. L'ensemble de ses pièces peut être pensé comme un décor total, décor-monde de l'apprivoisé, du domestique, cher et intime.

Lucie Lanzini is born in 1986 in Belfort (France).

She studied at *Ecole Nationale des Beaux arts de Lyon* (2004-2009). At *Art Contest*, she received the first price in 2010 and the Macors price at *Médiatine* in 2018. She had solo exhibitions in *Maac*, *Jozsa Gallery*, *B Gallery* (Brussels) and she participated in numerous group exhibitions : *Centre Wallonie Bruxelles* (Paris), *Musée Nissim de Camondo* (Paris), *La Mire* (Lyon resonate with the Biennale), *Archiraar Gallery* (Brussels), *Castillo Corales* (Paris), *La Vallée* (Bruxelles), *Hypercorps* (Bruxelles) etc...

She was selected for the residency *Est Nord Est* (Canada) and she studied in *Emily Carr Institute* (Vancouver) in 2008. She lives and works in Brussels.

Margré Steensma is born in 1989 in Ny altoenae (The Netherlands).

She studied at the *KASK* in Ghent from 2010 and received in 2013 her bachelor of image and installation art. In 2014 she graduated from her masters in fine art. Since her graduation she has been doing residencies in Glasgow and Rotterdam and had several exhibitions, solo, duo and group shows in *Chroxhapox* (Ghent), *The Briggait* (Glasgow), *Plagiarama* (Brussels), *Ibercaya Gallery* (Valencia), *CBK Zeeland* (Middelburg), *Kaus Australis* (Rotterdam). In 2016 she received the stipendium for young talent from the *Mondriaan Fonds*. She also participated at the *Prospects and Concepts* exhibition in 2017 during *Art Rotterdam*. In 2018 she received a project investment grant from the *Mondriaan Fonds* to work on her project *Other Spaces*. Margré Steensma works and lives in Rotterdam.
